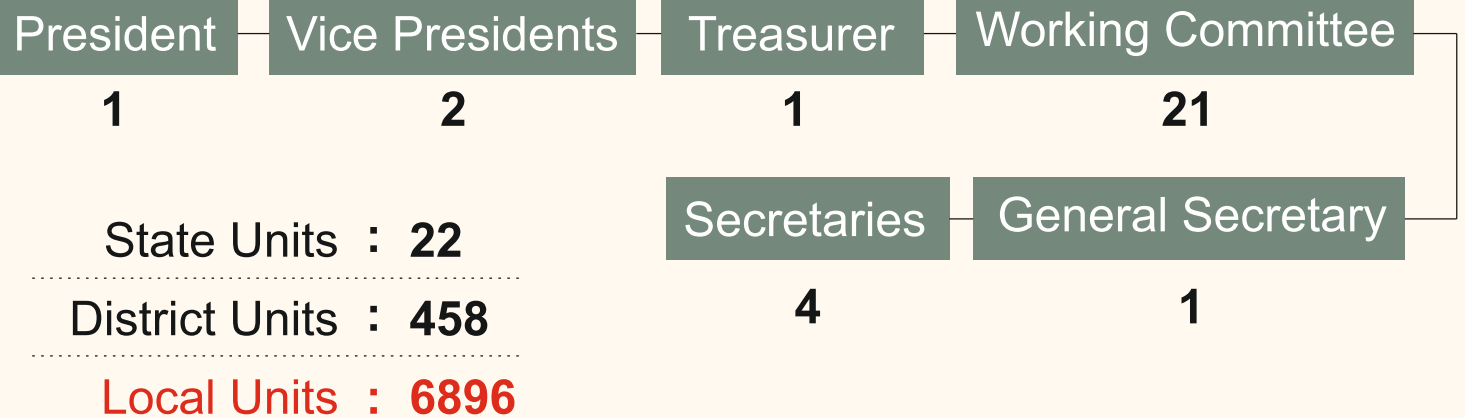

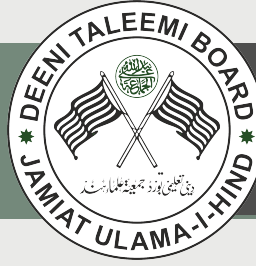

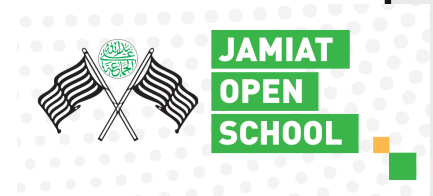

Mission

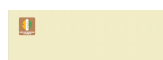

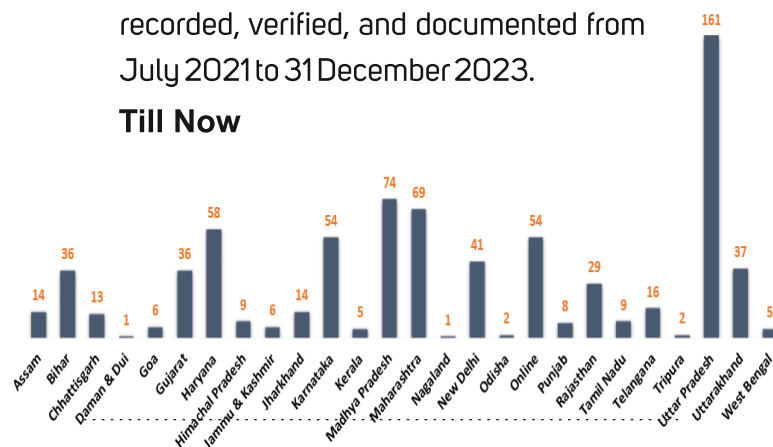

VERIFIED HATE CRIME CASES DOCUMENTED TILL NOW

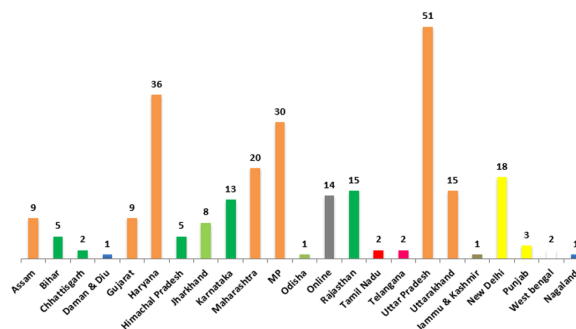

Jamiat Children Village

“The one who cares for an orphan and myself, will be together like this, and he held his two fingers together”. (Sahih Bukhari, 5659)



After the devastating earthquake in Anjar (Kutch) in 2001, in which 465 school children lost their lives, a Jamiat Children Village was constructed on 5.25 hectares of land at Anjar to commemorate their memory. The main aim of the project was to house and educate the orphans who had lost their parents during the earthquake and the Gujarat pogrom in 2002.

Jamiat dedicatedly worked to rebuild their shattered lives. Spacious dormitories at the village accommodated groups of 10 children, each under the supervision of an “ammi” or mother, in a room, to provide them a family atmosphere. Although the first batch of children accommodated there are now young adults - married and settled in their lives, the Jamiat Children Village marches on accommodating other orphans and deprived children. Out of 716 children in Jamiat schools, 59 are sponsored by JCV.

Functions

This amount will be spent on the following activities which will be implemented in respective local areas.

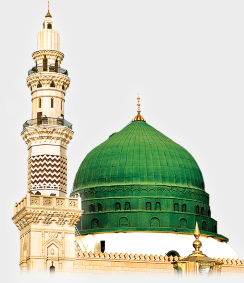
- A. Relief and rehabilitation.
