Jamiat Youth club has twin objectives that find their reference in the traditions of the Prophet of Islam (صلى الله عليہ وسلم).

- (1) Producing and preparing strong momin. This objective finds it resonance with a Prophet saying that a strong momin is dearer to Allah Almighty than a weaker one.
- (2) Preparing a momin for serving the humanity. The prophet of Islam is reported to have said that "Best among people are those who benefit mankind"



- a) To promote the spirit of the sportsmanship amongst the youth and the students studying in various Schools, Madarsas and other Institutions by way of training them in scouts and Guide, Self Defence, Yoga & other sports which are beneficial for their health.
- b) To promote the sense of brotherhood and nation loving amongst all the students throughout India and to make them aware about the exemplary acts of the nation builders, freedom fighters and leaders and about their great sacrifices for the nation.



- c) To promote the education amongst the youths belonging to all religions specially the underprivileged citizens of India and to open education centers all over India.
- (d) To create awareness amongst the citizens of India about the diseases and to open charitable Hospitals and dispensaries for providing health facilities.
- (e) To prevent harassment of women, children and of the weaker sections of the society.
- (f) To create awareness amongst the people about cleanliness and environment.



- (g) To rescue people from the habit of deadly drugs and other intoxicants.
- (h) To rescue the minors from the child labour.
- (i) To start welfare schemes for the widows, girls from underprivileged classes and to establish centres for that purpose.
- (j) To create awareness amongst the youth of the club to extend help for the needy.
- (k) To conduct awareness and training programs against terrorism.

- (I) To establish centres of health care for the children of the club.
- (m) To create awareness amongst the citizens for the proper use of the water and other natural resources.
- (n) And to generally do all the welfare work for the all classes of citizens of India.





ACTION PLAN

- 12.5 million youths shall be prepared for Jamiat Youth Club during next 10 years (till 2028)
- According to the plan, 20 Thousands fresh members shall be enrolled in 2021.



HOW WE NURTURE YOUTH?

- Basic scout master training is imparted at district level.
- Every member has to undergo compulsory scout training
- In every district a five days long training shall be conducted for commissioner level. At least one member from every district shall be imparted commissioner level training.
