REHABILITATION OF DELHI COMMUNAL VIOLENCE VICTIMS

In the aftermath of peaceful protest against CAA & NPR the Muslim concentrated colonies of North East Delhi witnessed heinous attacks starting from 23rd February 2020 resulting into heavy loss of lives and property. Jamiat started the relief operations within 72 hours of occurrence of the riots. While the riot The relief operation is briefly sketched hereunder:

Distribution of food kits	10,000	 HINDUSTAN TIMES, NEW DELHI TUESDAY, MARCH 17, 2020 <h3>HC seeks response on plea to preserve CCTV clips of riots</h3> <p>NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court on Monday sought the response of the Centre, Delhi government and the city police on a plea seeking directions to the preserve the CCTV footage and grain compensation in the wake of the recent riots in north-east Delhi.</p> <p>The bench of Chief Justice DN Patel and Justice C Hari Shankar issued notice to the authorities on the plea filed by Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind seeking FIR against those involved in the riot movement setting up of Special Investigation Team comprising retired judges of the Supreme Court and the High Court.</p> <p>The plea said that the police be directed to preserve the CCTV footage of the riot affected areas from February 23 to March 1 and should not remove debris without collecting evidence from the site. It contended that there was serious allegation of damage to the CCTV cameras and debris has also been removed to tamper the evidence from the site of riotous.</p> <p>The Public Interest Litigation (PIL) also contended that FIRs have not been lodged against persons responsible for the riots and alleged that the police is not accepting the complaint in which the accused are named and they are insisting to give complaint against unknown persons.</p> <p>The plea further sought taking social and disciplinary action against police officials for their alleged inaction or active participation in the riots and destruction of evidence. It has also sought direction to the Delhi government to provide adequate compensation to the victims in accordance to the scheme valid for the victims of the 1984 anti-Sikh riots.</p> <p>The matter would be now heard on March 27. RESISTANCE AGAINSTS CAA. NPR & NRC.



Since the law was drafted into Parliament, Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind has always been at the fore front opposing its introduction & implantation. **JUH** President Maulana Sayed Mohammad Usman Mansurpoori and **General Secretary Maulana Mahmood Madani**, have termed Citizenship Amendment Bill 2019 against the basic spirit of the constitution. Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind views this contentious act contrary to the basic principle of the constitution. JUH has always worked for the protection of constitution.

- Jamiat holds protest against CAA in two thousand cities and towns across India on December 13, 2019
- After the demonstration across the country a memorandum was also submitted to the Honorable President of India through District magistrates, District Collectors and Sub divisional magistrate asking him to use his good office to stop the injustice and communal targeting of people through such draconian law.
- Moving Supreme Court against Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019 praying for repealing this Draconian Act.
- JUH National Working Committee held on January 3, 2020 resolved to continue struggle against CAA until it is revoked.
- The Working Committee JUH while expressing its deep sympathy with those killed in anti CAA protest also decided to extend financial help of one lakh rupees to the next of the kins of them.
- In the resolution the Working Committee of JUH while deeply appreciating the anti CAA demonstrations across the country sternly condemns every form of violence whether committed by police or demonstrators. In a democratic set up citizen has right to peaceful protest. JUH condemned highhandedness and brutality of the Yogi Government against the CAA protestors in the state. CM.
- **On January 31, 2020** , a delegation of Jamiat Ulama-i -Hind handed over Rs one lakh as a financial compensation to the close family members of those persons who lost their lives.
- On February 22, 2020 Congregation of Scholars, lawyers and social workers to oppose the NPR and NRC which decided to boycott the NPR process
- Several rounds of discussions are being held on the issue.



MAKATIB AND DEENI TALEEMI MOVEMENT

Makatib and Deeni Taleemi Tahreek (Religious education Movement): Markazi Deeni Taleemi Board is an important wing of the Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind. The Board is directly running **268** makatib in the most backward areas of the country and its annual budget is **Rs 75 lakh**. Furthermore, under the supervision of state and local units of Jamiat, there are **24,915** makatibs. Thus the total number of makatib are **25,183**. Total number of students in these makatib are **6,70,388**. This year, Markazi Deeni Taleemi Board ran a nationwide awareness campaign from April 1 to 10, 2018 that would make a positive impact

LEGAL AID TO INNOCENT PERSONS FRAMED IN TERROR CASES

Legal aid to large number of innocent Muslim youths arrested on false charges of terrorism is being provided by Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind. JUH and its Maharashtra Unit have been fighting 170 cases across the country. Jamiat Ulama Maharashtra has been tasked to fight 153 cases while the central office is looking after some cases directly.

JUH PROVIDING LEGAL HELP TO THOSE ARRESTED FROM WESTERN UP IN NIA CRACKDOWN

In closing days of December 2018, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) arrested 10 Muslims and claimed to have foiled attempts to carry out a series of blasts in and around the national capital. At this critical juncture, Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind General Secretary Maulana Mahmood Madani came forward to help them. On his instruction, legal counsel, Advocate Mohammad Noorullah has been engaged to defend the accused. He is defending Sayyed, Raees, Irshad, Saqib, Mufti Suhail, Aabshar, Naeem. Their cases are being heard at regular intervals. Jamiat legal team is appearing on behalf of the accused.

LEGAL AID TO RIOTS VICTIMS

In India, there is instance of sudden communal riots, in which Muslims are mostly affected and in the same breath falsely targeted as culprits by agencies. Therefore Jamiat has to fight on two counts: justice for victims and justice for those targeted by govt agencies. 

PROTECTION OF RELIGIOUS RIGHTS

Challenge of Utrakhand High Court order banning fatwa

A Writ petition filed by Maulana Mahmood Madani, General Secretary of Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind on October 12, 2018, the Apex Court stayed the order of High Court Of Utrakhand banning issuance of fatwa. It was feared that the order of Utrakhand would have prevented thousands of Dar-al Ifta from issuing fatwa on different issues. In view of seriousness of the matter, JUH filed a Writ petition in the Supreme Court on September 4, 2018. At present now this matter is sub-judice.



CONGREGATION OF ISLAMIC JURISTS

Jamiat Ulama -i-Hind has separate department of Mabahithe Fiqhiye which holds congregation of Islamic jurists at intervals to discussion religious guidance about the modern issues. Till now the department has held 16 conferences on various important issues. In the last year on March 30, 2019:- A three days long sessions of Idara Mabahis-e-fiqhiya of Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind held in which About two hundred Islamic jurists from Darul Uloom Deoband, Nadawatul Ulama Lucknow, Jamia Qasmia Shahi Muradabad and different Islamic institutions participated. In one of resolutions, the jurists declared that using Google Adsense for advertising lawful goods etc is allowed. However Google Adsense for the promotion of movie and illegal programs is not allowed in Islamic Sharia. In the same resolution it has been said that financial transaction by different mobile Apps is also allowed. And cash back or reward points by Paytm or Easy Paisa etc.

JAMIAT CHILDREN VILLAGE, ANJAR

After devastating earthquake in 2001 in Kutch (Anjar), this institution was erected for orphans. The institution sponsors mostly those boys and girls who have nobody to care for them. The monthly expense comes on each child about RS **5000**. The lovable environment is the hallmark of the institution as children do not feel the absence of their mother. It offers children bank, congenial and open atmosphere to children. Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind also arranges marriages and accommodation for orphans after they attain adulthood. At present **1198** students get education at the village.
